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My Take: A Look Back, A Path Forward

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Serving on the ACC board of directors has been a highlight of my career. Not only have I had the opportunity to work alongside other extremely talented board members and ACC leadership, but I have grown and learned from so many within the global in-house community as an ACC member. Stepping into the role of board chair of this amazing association has been an immense honor and a very rewarding and fulfilling experience. As the world is still dealing with the implications of a global pandemic, I am proud of the work ACC has done and continues to do, to help our members lead and support their organizations and communities. In fact, in 2022 we celebrate 40 years of doing just that!

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A look back ... and forward

Some of that vital work included continuing ACC's commitment to diversity and inclusion within our profession. We launched the ACC Foundation's <u>Diversity</u>, <u>Equity</u>, <u>and Inclusion (DEI) Maturity Model</u> (MM) last year, and this year expanded its reach and potential through a partnership with Ethisphere. I applaud Team ACC on the many events, roundtables, and articles focused on this initiative that have helped law departments and organizations take a deeper look at their DEI functions and

procedures. Stay tuned for more to come on this exciting model, including an innovative DEI MM Benchmarking Assessment Tool, which will allow legal teams to further access and advance their efforts in this area.

In addition, we released important research like our annual <u>Chief Legal Officers Survey</u>, which offered insights from over 850 CLOs representing 20 industries and 38 countries. The report found that CLOs play a critical role in a company's leadership and as such, have increasing responsibilities in business functions like compliance (80 percent), ethics and privacy, and, of course, risk. Further, the report found that nearly a quarter of those surveyed have responsibilities in their organizations environmental, social, and governance (ESG) efforts. This is an area of significance for me, and I know many of you as well. In fact, I recently published an article for the *China Business Journal*, <u>"Steering the ESG Shift."</u> I encourage you to check it out – I'd love to hear <u>your thoughts</u> on how inhouse counsel can lead and support our teams in this important area.

Other notable research included the <u>Trends in Legal Transformation and Technology Report</u> (in partnership with DISCO), which captures insights from 278 law department leaders and legal operations professionals on how they've engaged transformation within their departments. I have highlighted just a small sample of ACC Research here and encourage you to learn more at <u>ACC.Com/survey-reports</u>. In fact, if you are a CLO and would like to contribute to the conversation by <u>participating in the 2023 Chief Legal Officer Survey</u>, you can do so until Oct. 28; the survey will be published in January!

This year also saw some of us tentatively coming back together again with in-person programming. ACC Europe held its annual conference in Madrid in May, the Executive Leadership Institute was held in July in Chicago, and the Global GC Summit was back in action in Zurich in June — the same month that ACC Foundation hosted its hybrid Global Women in Law & Leadership program. Again, I can't highlight all the innovative programming that happened this year, but you can peruse coming events on the Conferences & Professional Development page.

It's all about connections

Connecting our global membership to the resources and educational programming they need to lead their organizations successfully and safely, while also growing professionally via career-focused content and networking opportunities, is what ACC does best. I am proud that during my tenure as chair, this tradition of excellence has grown tremendously. Today, global membership stands at approximately 45,000 diverse members located in more than 100 countries! Knowing that you have access to a global network of thousands is a great benefit of ACC membership. That said, I encourage you to connect with your local chapter (ACC has more than 60 globally) and to check out the 21 practice area networks — they offer numerous resources and the ability to communicate directly with your colleagues via forums and more.

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Through my personal experience as a member of the APAC chapter — I became a member of the Australian Corporate Lawyers Association (ACLA) in 2010 — I quickly learned that nothing in private practice prepares you for the challenges of working in-house. That's where ACC came in: An online
